# MRC Tool Bucket Library



## What is a Tool Library?

*It is just like a regular library, but with tools instead of books!*

The MRC Tool Bucket Library provides free or low-cost access to shared tools and other durable goods and encourages self-reliance, re-use, repair, and reduced consumption. What do we have?

- ⇒ Gardening
- ⇒ Mechanical
- ⇒ Electrical
- ⇒ Plumbing
- ⇒ Carpentry
- ⇒ Masonry
- ⇒ Painting
- ⇒ Misc. Home repair
- ⇒ Hand tools
- ⇒ Power tools
- ⇒ Mowers, sprayers, & other powered equipment
- ⇒ Power cords
- ⇒ Hoses
- ⇒ And much more!

In the future, we will offer a Maker-Space which will provide space for learning how to use household tools, and enable members to use large tools that are not portable and require advance knowledge or supervision to operate.

## How do I become a member?

1. Complete a Membership Application.
2. Sign and Date the Liability Waiver and Tool Use Policy.
3. Provide identification to verify you are 18 years old and a local resident.

## How much will it cost to borrow tools?

The amount is based on self-identified household income levels. **Membership contributions are recommended but not required.**

No one will be turned away, and we never track or record household income levels.

## What if I return a tool late?

All tools must be returned clean and in good working condition within **one week** to avoid a late fee of **\$5 per week per tool**. Reservations may be extended for an additional week upon request unless tools are already reserved by others.

## What are membership and late fees used for?

Our aim is to keep the WSU Master Recycler Composters of Lewis County (dba MRC Tool Bucket Library) a financially sustaining 501(c)3, non-profit organization.

We use membership donations and late fees to run this volunteer project by buying and maintaining our tools for the community to share.

Other expenses include consumable items such as drill bits, saw blades, etc., repair supplies, and library software and equipment needed for basic operations.

This material is funded through a Participation Grant from the Washington State Department of Ecology.
