

Waymakers Huntington Beach Youth Shelter



The Waymakers Huntington Beach Youth Shelter is a non-profit 12-bed emergency crisis intervention refuge for homeless, runaway, abused, and at-risk youth ages 11-17. The program is in compliance with all State and local licensing requirements. The Shelter is fully staffed and operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, each day of the year.

The youth we serve are typically referred by schools, police departments, hospitals, community centers, counselors and/or are self-referrals.

Immediate emergency support, therapy (individual, group and family) and case management are offered in order to divert youth from running away, resolve family conflicts, work for family reunification, and when needed, assist in finding long-term family shelter or housing. In addition, the Program offers a structured daily schedule of activities designed to enable youth to develop healthier behaviors and life skills, and to permanently leave the streets.

Goals

- 1. Family Strengthening and reunification
- 2. Diversion of at risk youth from the juvenile justice system
- 3. Homelessness prevention
- 4. School drop-out prevention
