PANTRY TECHNOLOGY EDUCATOR

The Agency Relations & Programs team is looking for individuals who are tech-savvy and who can do accurate data entry in a new software program that is being implemented in food pantries, soup kitchens, and shelters across our service area. The work will take place at the partner agency sites.

Work location: Throughout service area at offsite locations (food pantries).

LEAD VOLUNTEER

Lead Volunteers orient groups of new volunteers to the Food Bank, our programs, and the work to be performed that day and will then supervise these groups in their activities. They may lead tours of the Food Bank, as well. These positions are ongoing (i.e., not one-time). Shifts are scheduled subject to availability (flexible). A lead volunteer will have a demonstrated commitment to the Food Bank's mission for a minimum of 6 months before accepting the Lead Volunteer position.

Lead Volunteers combine their love of volunteering with their leadership skills to supervise, and may work occasional evening and weekend warehouse work, special events, and some warehouse functions. **Work locations available: Charlottesville, Winchester**

PHOTOGRAPHER

The best kind of storytelling is visual. Pictures are an important way for the Food Bank to illustrate, communicate and reinforce our culture and the impact of our work. Donate your photography skills to help document our events, programs, volunteers and staff. The work is sporadic and can often be scheduled at your convenience. **Work location: Throughout service area.**

VIDEOGRAPHER AND VIDEO EDITOR

If you have an eye for capturing great moments through video, we'd love to have your help! Help us capture and tell the stories of people in our community who are food insecure. Put your video editing skills to work to provide us with tools we can use to communicate. The work can often be scheduled at your convenience. **Work location: Throughout service area.**

Training and orientation will be provided for volunteers by the respective department. We ask that these volunteers commit to volunteering regularly, meaning a regularly scheduled time slot that is mutually beneficial.

WRITER

If you have a knack for words and love to tell a human-interest story, we could use your talents! Help us capture and tell the stories of people in our community who are food insecure themselves, or the stories of those who are helping to feed them. This work may involve regional travel and will require you to schedule interviews and visits at the convenience of the story's subject. We would like to see writing samples, as part of your application process. **Work location: Throughout service area**

COMMUNITY OUTREACH AMBASSADOR

Do you enjoy attending concerts, community fairs and other events? If so, help us advocate for hunger relief as a Community Outreach Ambassador. Raise your voice on behalf of the Food Bank and represent our organization at special events in your area. Share our story by interacting with community members and provide handouts and education on the work we do and the neighbors we serve. Shifts are known in advance and may include some evenings and weekends. **Work location: Throughout service area, as needs arise.**

TRANSLATOR

As a volunteer translator with the Food Bank, use your skills and expertise to ensure people have access to vital nutrition information. The most-needed languages include Spanish, Arabic, and Russian; however, there could be help needed in other languages. The volunteer will serve as an interpreter for the Partner Services Coordinator and the pantry staff. Shifts are based on pantry hours. **Work location: Throughout service area at our partner agencies, as needs arise.**

ADMINISTRATIVE/CLERICAL VOLUNTEERS

Assist our dedicated and friendly staff with general administrative tasks. Volunteers are needed to assist with filing, paperwork, and organizing large mailings. Administrative volunteers are needed in many departments, so if you have excellent attention to detail, computer experience, or the ability to organize and balance multiple projects, consider sharing your talents with us. Shifts are flexible, and ongoing work is available. **Work location available: Verona**

SUBSTITUTE RECEPTIONIST

As the face of the Blue Ridge Area Food Bank in Verona, our receptionist serves as an ambassador, greeting volunteers, visitors and guests, and directing them to the appropriate areas. This volunteer will serve as back-up to our full-time receptionist to cover the responsibilities of the position during planned vacations. Answer incoming phone calls; notify Food Bank staff of visitor arrivals and other front desk duties. Shifts are known in advance and can be planned with you. **Work location available: Verona**
