As you may know, April is Autism Awareness Month. Did you know that the CDC statistic for autism in the state of Utah is 1 in 54 children, which is higher than the national average of 1 in 68? Chances are you know someone who is autistic or has a family member with autism. Because the diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder is just that (a spectrum) ASD people can range from very high functioning to extremely low functioning and non-verbal. With the right resources, acceptance, and love, though, they can live pretty extraordinary lives.

We are excited to announce the Second Annual Awesome Autistic Ogden event which will be held at the **Ogden School District 1950 Monroe Blvd, Special Education building in the Shiny Gym** on Saturday April 11<sup>th</sup>, 2020 from 11a-2p.
