
"Quillows" for CeCe's

What Is A Quillow?

A twin size fleece blanket folded up into a square pocket of the same fabric (see back of flyer for specifics). It will be provided to law enforcement & first responders to address the initial needs of trafficked victims.

Hygiene Kit

- ▶ 1 gallon size ziploc bag
- Deodorant & Lotion
- ▶ Hand Wipes & Hand Sanitizer
- ▶ Toothbrush & Toothpaste
- ▶ Hair Ties & Comb
- Shampoo & Conditioner (travel size)

Sewing a Quillow

Materials:

Twin size fleece blanket Extra fabric to make the quillow pocket square

Sewing Instructions:

- 1. Turn over once and hem the unfished edge of the blanket (You do not have to turn it under twice)
- 2. Square: Turn over once and hem the two unfished ends of the square which are perpendicular to the finished edge (keep the edge opposite of the finished edge unfinished)
- 3. Find the shorter end of the blanket and fold it in half. Mark the halfway point with a pin
- 4. Fold the unfinished end of the square to the blanket right sides together/unfinished edges go out
- 5. Pin the unfinished end of square to blanket right sides together/unfinished edges out
- 6. Pin the two finished perpendicular square edges to the blanket. Measure the length of the unfinished edges. Measure the length of the bottom of the square (opposite unfinished edge), Stretch this edge of the square as needed to achieve the same length as the unfinished edge.
- 7. Sew the three pinned sides, leaving the finished edge un-sewed
